Weather or not....

In the past one of the safest topics of conversation has often been to talk about the weather, it may still be so. Weather is something that one cannot ignore. Oh yes, there are times when one becomes indifferent to our weather patterns, after all there is little that can be done about the current weather situation. At its best weather can be very pleasant and reassuring, but when it snows and when it blows, weather demands our attention. Because of the necessity to be aware of the status of the weather, especially when severe weather is upon us, we need to be vigilant and be prepared to deal with the adverse effects of weather. We may not be able to change the weather, but we can deal with it if we try. Under "normal conditions" it is fairly easy to deal with the weather that we experience in the Midwest. The trouble comes in when the weather is not "normal", you know what I mean, those times when the weather changes suddenly and we get caught unprepared for the change. Mostly though the weather he is fairly predictable. We are used to having 4 seasons of weather. Some say that the 4 seasons that we have are: "Almost Winter, Winter, Still Winter, and Road Repair". This assessment though somewhat humorous, is fairly accurate and most people here have grown accustomed to it being that way. Generally, this is the pattern of our expected weather experience.

Oh yes, there are times when things get a bit out of hand. One of the times that comes to mind for us older Hams is what is known as the "65 Flood". I was in High School at that time and when the floods came in over the Easter holiday, we were mostly caught flat footed. The flood was so serious that the Causeway was so full of water that there were people in boats going up and down it to get from the North Side to the South Side and back. Some people were fishing there and I can recall a friend of mine who caught a large Northern Pike there, a reporter from the La Crosse Tribune was with him and took a picture of him with his prize catch. The reporter did an article about it and put it with the photo on the from page of the La Crosse Tribune. Another image that was also posted in the Tribune was the image of E.R. "Boss" Schultz, a local beer distributor, standing waist deep in the water in the living room of his house that had been flooded. There were plenty of photos also of the volunteers who manned the dikes who made and carried sand bags to protect as much of our city as possible. Our High Schools were closed for over a week so that the students could help with the sand bagging effort. Meanwhile as if things weren't bad enough, our local TV station channel 8 caught fire and burned to the ground because the fire trucks couldn't get there in time to save it.

More recently, most of us can remember the tornado that went through La Crosse several years ago. This was especially surprising since there was and old Indian tradition that said that "Where three rivers meet there couldn't be a tornado." Fortunately, the resulting damage was fairly easily repaired and no one was hurt or killed. Our radio club members were on the spot relaying reports to the National Weather Service office on top of Grand Dad's Bluff. The tornado had knocked out most of the land line telephone service and the cell phone services were so flooded with calls that it was impossible to get a call through.

Call for volunteers for Irishfest

Fellow Members:

For those members who haven't heard, the Riverland Amateur Radio Club will be conducting a Special Event station during Irishfest La Crosse (held on the main Oktoberfest grounds) on Saturday August 14th. I am formally requesting volunteers to help with this event.

To date, the Ballymena Amateur Radio Club, East Leinster Amateur Radio Club, Mid-Ulster Amateur Radio Club, and the Shannon Basin Radio Club from Ireland have committed to making contacts with our Special Event Station.

In order to facilitate setup and tear for the event, I have broken down the event into (4) two hour shifts with each shift being manned by three to four hams. Those hams not directly operating on the radio and trying to make contacts would be asked to interact with festival attendees, particularly the younger generation. Members who can volunteer their time to the event will have free access to Irishfest La Crosse on Saturday and are welcome to spend the rest of the day after their shift enjoying the festival. Unfortunately, per Irishfest La Crosse policy non volunteering members will need to pay to get into the festival if they wish to come to the event.

The first shift would start at 10:00 AM that morning allowing for setup and tweaking before starting the Special Event at 11:00 AM. The main festival activities don't start until noon, so the first shift crew will likely not have much interaction with festival attendees.
